THE URGENCY FOR IMPACT

- Personal evangelism is the fire behind John Maxwell and his teaching.
- When people learn and live good values, they themselves become more valuable.

"You don't coast to the high road. You coast to the low road." - John C. Maxwell

HIGH ROAD LEADERSHIP

- Everyone deserves to be led well.
- Being a high-road leader is essential and requires intentionality and personal growth.
- As Christians, we are supposed to be making people "hungry, not angry."
- The Christian community needs to focus on living out Christian values and being salt and light in a divided world.

- In an election year, Christians should be hyper-aware of how they behave and how they represent Jesus to the world.
- Leaders should have an inner circle that can provide feedback and hold them accountable.
- It's important to recognize when we veer off the high road and take steps to get back on track. Have an "inner circle" that can lead you back to the high road.
- Jesus was the ultimate high-road leader, and as Christians, we need to do what Jesus did and live as he lived.
