#### **ELECTION SEASON & LEADERSHIP**

- As leaders, it's important to encourage our Churches to vote.
- Policies are more crucial than the people who represent them. Think more about what you are voting for versus who you are voting for.
- The principles we have are Biblical before they are political. It's a great idea to teach more Biblical principles to our churches and trust that God will stir them on the inside when going to the ballot box to vote.
- The book "Jesus, the High Road Leader" shows great examples of how Jesus lived out Biblical values in the middle of a divided culture.
- Some pastors have the grace to talk more about politics than others. Follow God's direction
  as you feel the need to talk more or less about these topics.

#### **FALL & THE HOLIDAYS**

- Now is the time to think ahead and "stack the dominoes" for November through January.
- We redeem historically low-attendance Sundays (before and after Thanksgiving) by launching a major series called *At the Movies*! So wherever you note your lowest attended Sundays, consider having an *At the Movies* type of message series.
- This is also a great time to share vision and talk about generosity before people are thinking about their year-end giving.
- People are also in a giving mood, so consider hosting outreaches during the holiday season to engage new volunteers and meet these needs of your community through Thanksgiving or Christmas outreaches like *Giving Hope*.
- With all of these, we need to lead ahead of the next season.

#### **DEFINE VISION & DEVELOP GIVERS**

- When defining vision, it must first be clear.
- This is the ideal time of year to develop givers by telling stories of impact and creating a plan for end-of-year giving.
- While these stories are meaningful and moving, be sure to share them ahead of time so people have time to plan ahead and be intentional givers.
- We work to define the vision areas within 5 Legacy Lanes (Highlands Projects, Highlands College, and then Local, National, and Global Outreach).
- The projects we share at the end of the year are specific to items that we are trying to push across the finish line now!
- Consider, what would you do if someone wanted to give you a check for one million dollars. Do you already have vision for it in your church, community, country, or the world?
- Share the vision that God has given you, and then trust God for the results!

#### PREPARING FOR CHRISTMAS & 21 DAYS OF PRAYER

- This is a great time to start preparing for Christmas and the New Year!
- Our Christmas services include a candlelight service and during it, we highlight the next season which is 21 Days of Prayer. The Christmas domino goes into the Prayer domino.
- If you go ahead and decide what you are going to talk about in January, you can start sharing it with everyone, including visitors, who attend during the Christmas Season.
- To make these happen with excellence, we need to start thinking about these things now.
  - October leads into November with giving, evangelism, and At the Movies. Then we lead into Christmas and 21 Days of Prayer in January.
